What do you need?

Unrestricted multiyear funding and partnerships

Frameworks for Shared Ownership, Belonging and Responsibility and internal organizational systems and processes that mirror the systemic changes desired in the broader community.

Authentic and fair partnerships with the St'át'imc community to ensure their voices and perspectives are central in decision-making processes, and to establish new, respectful, and mutually beneficial relationships between St'át'imc and non-Indigenous communities.

Safe and Supportive Community Space that is supported by a strong operating model and clear scope of work.

Internal and external expertise, resources, social impact tools and external knowledge

Activities

What do you do?

Community Connect Innovation Hub: Space rental, shared services, storefront, direct service contracts, and more.

Community Conversations and Interventions: Dialogues, events, and interventions around social and restorative justice, reconciliation, and other critical topics

Mentorship, Training, Programming and Project Incubation: Coordination and/or hosting of programs like CED, entrepreneurship, youth employment, food security, environment, etc. and incubation and administration for values aligned community initiatives

Outputs

Community members accessing supportive workspace, and ecosystem, and experiencing increased sense of belonging.

Community members gaining awareness and understanding of restorative justice principles and action plans resulting from dialogues

Locals trained in in-demand skills; businesses / organizations have increasing access to critical talent needs

Organizations access support for operational effectiveness, financial sustainability and scaling their impact
